- At age 16, Lauren first discloses the abuse she endured for six years at the hands of her live-in nanny, Waldina Flores, and learns that she is one of 42 million survivors of child sexual abuse in the U.S.
- Waldina Flores is convicted.
- Lauren Book passes her first set of state laws to protect children from sexual abuse and better serve survivors, the first of nearly two dozen legislative victories in this arena.
- Lauren's Kids is founded and becomes an official 501(c)(3).
- Lauren embarks on her first 'Walk in My Shoes' awareness and advocacy walk across the state of Florida, walking 500 miles from her childhood home in Miami to the steps of historic Florida Capitol in Tallahassee.
- Lauren's memoir, It's OK to Tell, is released.
- Lauren submits testimony to the Children and Families Subcommittee of the U.S. Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions in response to the Penn State scandal.
- Second 'Walk in My Shoes' statewide awareness walk; Lauren lengthens the route to walk 1,000 miles across Florida
 from Key West to Tallahassee during March and April, National Child Abuse Prevention Month and National
 Sexual Assault Awareness Month.
- Third 'Walk in My Shoes' statewide awareness walk; Lauren lengthens the route to walk 1,500 miles, beginning
 in Key West and walking north, zig-zagging from coast to coast before reaching the steps of the Historic Florida
 Capitol in Tallahassee.
- Florida schools begin implementing the Pre-K/Kindergarten installment of Lauren's Kids' *Safer, Smarter Kids* prevention education curriculum.
- Fourth 'Walk in My Shoes' statewide walk. Lauren Book walked 1,500 miles from Key West to Tallahassee during March and April, National Child Abuse Prevention Month and National Sexual Assault Awareness Month.
- In the wake of the Penn State scandal, Lauren's legislative advocacy helps influence the passage of the toughest abuse
 reporting law in the country, designating ALL Floridians as mandatory reporters of suspected abuse and increasing
 penalties for failure to report.
- Following the expansion of Florida's mandatory reporting law, Lauren's Kids and the Florida Department of
 Children and Families roll out the "Don't Miss the Signs" campaign, educating adults on the signs of abuse and their
 responsibility to report; the award-winning awareness campaign has been replicated throughout the country.
- State of Florida and Lauren's Kids create *Safer, Smarter Kids* abuse prevention education curriculum for children with special needs and Trauma Informed Care training for foster parents who foster children with sexual abuse backgrounds.
- Governor Rick Scott signs law to create Lauren's Kids specialty license plate.
- Lauren Book is named the 2013 L'Oreal Paris Woman of Worth by actress Lea Michele.
- Lauren Book walks 1,500 miles across the state of Florida for the fifth time, empowering survivors with the message that *It's OK to Tell*, and preventing abuse through education and awareness. Lauren's advocacy helps pass the most comprehensive legislative package on child protection in the history of the state of Florida.
- Lauren is named one of Cosmopolitan Magazine's 'Fun, Fearless Females'.

May 2014

Lauren travels to The Bronx to implement her Safer, Smarter Kids abuse prevention curriculum, thanks to
funding from The New York Yankees Foundation. From there, she heads to The Hague, Netherlands to deliver a
keynote address in front of government officials and experts preceding their first-ever study on child sexual abuse
in Holland.

July 2014

• Lauren travels to Barbados with Crime Stoppers International and UNICEF to tackle child sexual abuse in the Carribbean, following news of an outbreak of childhood HIV and AIDS because of child sexual abuse.

August 2014

• Pilot testing for *Safer*, *Smarter Kids* grades 1 – 3 begins in Florida, with grades 4 – 5 and middle and high school to follow in 2015.

October 2014

• Lauren travels to Cape Town, South Africa to speak at the Crime Stoppers International Conference and teach lessons from *Safer, Smarter Kids*.

February 2015 March & April 2015

- Children's book, Lauren's Kingdom, is released.
- Lauren Book will walk the state of Florida for the sixth time, bringing total miles walked in the name of child protection to 7,500 since 2010.
